EDEXIM DNA Version

Welcome to the DNA version of EDEXIM.

This version of EDEXIM enables you to manage export notifications for the Annex I chemicals (both as pure substances and in preparations) you receive from your exporters and to manage issues related to explicit consent.

N.B. the Help On-line has not yet been fully implemented for this version of EDEXIM and will gradually be integrated.

What about waivers?

- If you don't receive any reply from the importing country within 60 days from your request for explicit consent, Article 13(7) can be applied. If you have "evidence from official sources in the importing Party or other country that the chemical has been licensed, registered or authorised", you can send the proof by email to the European Commission (to Mr. Jürgen Helbig, juergen.helbig@ec.europa.eu) asking for a waiver from the explicit consent for that particular notification. If he grants the waiver, you can upload his email (proof that the waiver has been granted) together with the certificate to EDEXIM, following the steps described above (5-8), taking care of specifying in the notes that it is a waiver pursuant to Article 13(7), as it is the only way to distinguish a waiver from a "normal" explicit consent.

- In case of chemicals of Part 2 (and only Part 2) to be exported to OECD countries you can ask for a waiver from the explicit consent, provided that you have the proof that "the chemical, at the time of importation into the OECD country concerned, is licensed, registered or authorised in that OECD country". Once the waiver has been granted by Mr. Helbig, you can upload it to EDEXIM following the steps described above and specifying that it is a waiver pursuant to Article 13(6).

N.B.: Waivers are different from explicit consents!!! Waivers are granted on a case-by-case basis, and are only valid for one year. Furthermore, unlike explicit consents, you cannot use a waiver granted to another Member State to activate one notification of yours.
